As a sports chaplain, it is your sacred duty and high privilege to love and to lead the people in your charge. You must be willing to invest and begin a journey of faith that will be most fulfilling for you and for those whom you serve.

Serving Athletes and Students by offering guidance and connecting students with their faith through mentoring, FCA Huddles (Bible Studies), team meals, study tables, events and chapel services.
