Keith Byars, 2018 Ohio Sports Legend Honoree



The 2018 Ohio Sports Legend is Keith Byars. Keith Byars attended Roth High School in Dayton, Ohio and Trotwood Madison High School, in Trotwood, Ohio. He was a tailback with the Ohio State Buckeyes from 1982 to 1985. Byars finished second to Doug Flutie in the Heisman Trophy voting. Keith was a consensus [All-American \(1984\)](#) Big Ten Most Valuable Player (1984). All Buckeyes remember the most famous play of his college career; a shoeless 67 yard touchdown run vs Illinois 1984. Keith was a first-round draft choice for the Philadelphia

Eagles in 1986. His career ended with the Philadelphia Eagles; however, he also played for the Miami Dolphins (1993–1996), New England Patriots (1996–1997), and the New York Jets (1998).

Keith was selected to the : [Pro Bowl \(1993\)](#) [All-Pro \(1990\)](#) [Philadelphia Eagles 75th Anniversary Team](#). In 2015, Byars was named to the College Football Hall of Fame ballot along with two other Buckeye greats LB Tom Cousineau and FB Jim Otis as well as former coach Jim Tressel. Keith has been named again on the ballot for 2018 with two other Ohio State players – FB Jim Otis and DT Chris Ward. Keith is currently a sports radio show host and television analyst in his hometown of Dayton, OH

Tom Montgomery: (Keith Byars HS Coach)

JD Bergman: Ohio State alumni and part of the Team USA wrestling team, he is an accomplished athlete and a strong supporter of outreach in the community. Bergman was a four time NCAA qualifier and three time NCAA player, including finishing second in the 2008 NCAA D1 Wrestling Championships. Bergman has been on seven USA World teams (top 3 finish in the World/Olympic trials), in Greco-Roman. Bergman is also a two-time Cerro Pelado champion (2010 and 2015), and a 2014 Brazil Cup Champion.

Ben Buchanan: Graduated from Ohio State with a career ranking fourth all-time in school history in punts (177) and yards (7,286), and his 41.2 career average ranks eighth in school history. He is currently an Ohio State Sport Management Doctoral (PhD) Student, and a current broadcaster for ABC/NBC. He was also the 2013 FCA Central Ohio Athlete of the Year.

Roy Hall

Roy Hall is a former NFL wide receiver. He was drafted by the Indianapolis Colts in the fifth round of the 2007 NFL Draft. Hall was also a member of the New Orleans Saints and Detroit Lions. He played college football at Ohio State. Roy is President and co-founder of the Columbus, OH based non-profit organization, Driven Foundation, established in 2008. Website: www.StayDriven.org. Driven’s infrastructure is built on recycling community adversity and difficulties, and using them to motivate those who are challenged, to produce a persevering, “never quit” mentality. We accomplish this by offering specialized events and programs, that combat community and individual shortcomings that seemed impossible to overcome. Driven is a dependable organization of versatility.

Sue Ramsey: In the spring of 2015, Sue Ramsey retired from an illustrious 35 year coaching career. For the past 20 years she has served Ashland University as their Head Women’s Basketball Coach. Coach Ramsey’s final record as a head coach is 501-364 (.579). The 2011-12 and 2012-13 seasons were particularly memorable as the Eagles won the Division II national title (2013) and finished as the Division II national runner-up (2012). She was honored as FCA’s 2015 Ohio Sports Legend.

William White: He received his Bachelor of Science in Metallurgical Engineering from The Ohio State University. He was starting cornerback from 1984-1987 and team captain in 1987. White was drafted by the Detroit Lions in 1988 and played professionally for 11 years. He ended his career with the Atlanta Falcons after Super Bowl XXXIII, where he led the team with 13 tackles. Since 2001, White has served as a director at Trazer Technologies, Inc., a world leader in the use of computer-based simulation for the improvement of health, physical performance and fitness of everyone. He was honored as FCA’s 2011 Ohio Sports Legend.
